Last year 95 million persons called in for the time, which is checked for split-second accuracy every hour. Errors as small as <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> a

second are corrected immedi-ately. One silver grey audichron machine serves the whole machine serves the whole Southern California area from Ventura to San Diego and as far east as Palmdale. From the center of Los Angeles the voice is sent by telephone lines to each exchange where it is passed on to subscribers when they call in

It is passed on to subscribers when they call in. Twice a year the daily num-ber of calls for the correct time takes a sharp rise. Adults re-set their alarm clocks and "Little Willy" calls on Mon-tay morning o see if it is eally time to leave for school.
