EDITORIALS

Who Benefits?

Action of Mayor Isen in removing Councilman Drale from the Inter-City Highway Committee this week is being criticized by many who are aware of Drale's long interest in the highway problem and his major contribution to the progress of highways in this area.

The HERALB believes the mayor acted hastily and with a greater regard to political obligations than to his obligation to the people of this area to have the most qualified representative on this important body.

The Inter-City Highway Committee, composed of civic leaders and officials of Torrance and South Bay cities, through the past several years has made state officials acutely aware of the pressing need for major highway construction throughout the area. The committee has been largely credited with lopping several years off the time schedule for both the Harbor and San Diego Freeways proposed for this part of the county.

Under the chairmanship of Drale, the San Diego Committee set up by the Inter-City group visited Sacramento and put facts and figures before the California Highway Commission which brought a change in the project schedule to the benefit of construction here.

Later the group, with Drale again as spokesman, appeared before the Highway Commission in Sacramento and pleaded the cause of the San Diego Freeway and added early completion of the Harbor Freeway at least to 190th

St., to the committee's requests. To remove Drale from this committee deprives the city of Torrance and the Inter-City Committee of several years of valuable experience, which includes an acquaintance with members of the Highway Commission and other

important bodies. The HERALD cannot believe the mayor's action was in in the best interest of the city or the area.

Opinions of Others

We still maintain that if the postal service were turned over to private industry, and given exactly the same budget that it now operates on, said private enterprise would make a fabulous profit and give far better service than is now the general rule. The sooner that Uncle Sam starts stepping out of an activity that could be handled by private enterprise, the sooner that the government will start shrinking back to the job that it was originally designed for-the simple (not really so simple) task of running the government.
