Come Here in 1937 Mrs. Pons came to Torrance with her late husband in 1937 after fleeing Germany to escape the Nazi purge. A native of Grodno, Poland, she had lived in Germany for 20 years prior to coming to America.

For years after she and her husband came to Torrance, she lived with a mounting dread for the fate of relatives she left behind. After World War II, she received a letter from a younger sister, Ciwa, living in Tel Aviv, who reported that relatives escaping from Germany reported that Mrs. Pon's mother, father, another sister, and two brothers, along with other relatives, had been mur-

dered in a concentration camp and their property confiscated. Will Regain Property "It will take time, but we will regain some of our prop-erty," Mrs. Pons said after re-turning from Germany
