"Analyses of traffic accidents reveal that speed too fast for conditions is the leading contributing factor in the majority of traffic accidents," stated B. R. Caldwell, patrol commissioner. "Usually, driv-ers run traffic lights and stop signs, drive on the wrong side of the roadway, and violate auto or pedestrian right-of-way because they are driving at speeds too fast for existing

conditions.

"Records indicate that 36.4 per cent of all violations noted in injury and fatal accidents last year in California were charged to exceeding stated speed limits or speed too fast for conditions." Caldwell said. "The good driver recognizes the need for the prudent use of speed as a means of staying

of speed as a means of staying out of accident trouble.

"Obedience to the posted and prima facie speed limits is always necessary," he concluded. "However, many times speeds less than the prima facie or posted limits are required to avoid accident poten. quired to avoid accident poten-tials," Caldwell stated.


