Board of Education Names Six New Principals for Torrance

Three Torrance principals will take over new posts this September, while three new men will become principals of local schools, it was announced at the Board of Education meeting Tuesday.

Lester Foster, Edison School principal, will become principal of the new Columbia School and George Adrich, Madrona principal, will open the new Jefferson School. Marich's spot at Madrona will be filled by William B. Forrest, El Nido principal.

Taking over at El Nido School will be Edwin Brown, vice principal at Fern-Greenwood. Donald R. Credell, Carr vice principal, will replace Foster at Edison School.

A high-ling principal from Yucca Valley, Myrl C. Ruppel, will head the operations at the new Carl Mayor School. A private pilot, he flew his own plane to Torrance to be interviewed for the position.

The same three new vice principals were assigned at eight district schools, with two former Torrance YMCA secretaries taking over school positions. Stan Roberts, Perry teacher and former Y secretary here, will become vice principal at Seaside School, while another former Y official who is now vice principal at Meadow Park, Richard Brown Jr., will move to Steele School.

Other vice principal posts will be filled by Marjorie Reaguard, Parkway teacher, Carr School; John S. McCue, Sepulveda teacher, Fern-Greenwood; Bobby Jean Vassar, Hillside teacher, Edison School; Carl Wallner, Fern-Greenwood teacher, Wood School; Henry Ebbrens, Seaside vice principal, Arlington School; and Walter Buettenbach, Wood vice principal, Perry School.

Of the newly assigned principals, Foster and Marich have served in the district since it was started in 1917.

A former president of the Torrance Co-ordinating Council, the 43-year-old Foster will head the new Columbia School for the handicapped. The building will be completed in mid-year and will operate at Meadow Park School until late next year.
