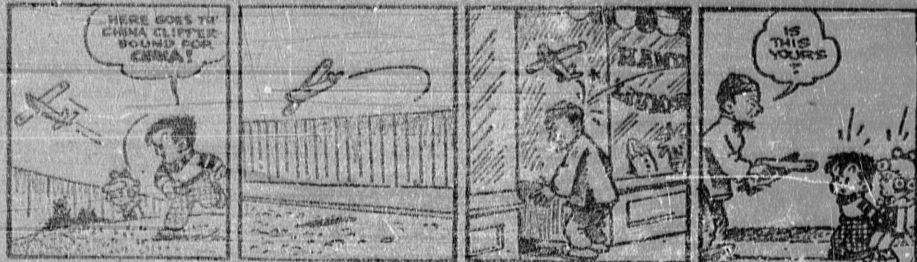

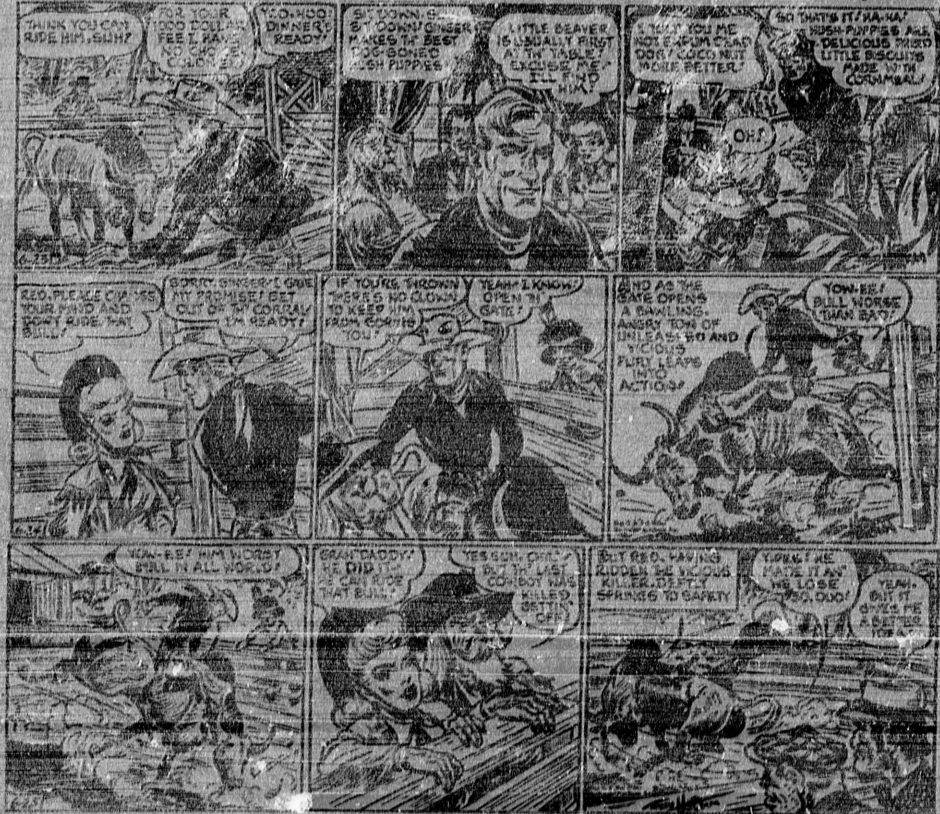

Chace Changes Deputies Here

Franc Winter, chief deputy of Chairman Horton W. Chace of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors will replace the city of Torrance as the supervisor's office, beginning July 1, it was announced yesterday.

Winter's assignment to Torrance, Chace said, is part of a program to familiarize staff with all parts of the district.

The municipality, for the past five years, has been served locally by Richard L. Newton.

Superior Court Sought by City

A request for establishment of a Superior Court here was forwarded to the County Board of Supervisors this week in the form of a city council resolution.

The resolution was adopted by the council Tuesday after it had been modified to include the Torrance request, along with a request that a temporary criminal division be established at the Inglewood Superior Court.

At the present time, criminal

cases filed here are tried in Long Beach Superior Court. Cases originating north of 190th St. are tried in Los Angeles.

Civil cases from this area can be tried in Long Beach, Los Angeles, Inglewood, or Compton.

Others scheduled to receive the city resolution include the Legislature's Joint Interim Judiciary Committee and the presiding judge of the Los Angeles Superior Court.


School Superintendent Foresees Fall Bond Vote

A bond election to get additional money to continue the Torrance Schools elementary building program may be needed this fall, Assistant Superintendent S. E. Waldrip told the Board of Education Tuesday night.

Waldrip presented figures indicating that the district is nearing the end of the \$10,000,000 approved by the voters in 1955 to finance the building of new elementary schools. To be eligible for state aid funds in school building, the district must be bonded to 85 per cent of its capacity. Additional sale of bonds will bring the district below that figure late this year, Waldrip said.

Torrance receives state aid for its elementary building program, but the high school building program is maintained entirely through local taxes and other funds.
