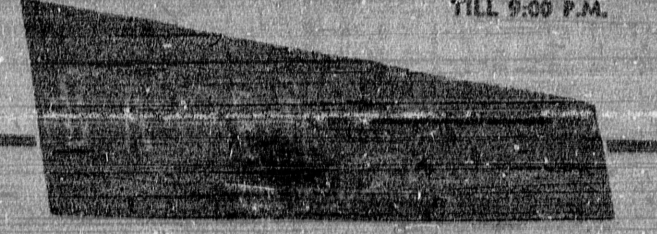

Underwater Diving Class Now Offered

Commencing this summer, SCUBA (Self-Contained Underwater Breathing Apparatus) diving class is being offered at the municipal plunge in Torrance.
 The diving class is set up to instruct swimmers in the use of breathing apparatus. In addition to this class, other activities and instructional classes are offered throughout the summer.
 The regular swim periods which are open to all are daily 1 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Saturdays 9 a.m. to noon, and 1 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. Sunday—noon to 5 p.m. and holidays—10 a.m. to noon and 1 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. Adult classes in instruction are offered Monday and Wednesday, 5:30 to 9:30 p.m. beginning June 30.
 A family night is held every Thursday evening from 7 to 10 p.m. On Fridays from 7 to 10 p.m. an adults only swim session is held. Private parties can be scheduled on Saturdays and Sundays, 7 to 10 p.m.
 Classes in swimming instruction, ages 7 to 12 inclusive, are offered Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to noon. The 2nd sessions are: first session—June 16 to 21; second session—June 30 to July 11; third session—July 14 to 25; fourth session—July 28 to Aug. 8; fifth session—Aug. 11 to 22; sixth session—Aug. 24 to Sept. 5.
 As a special feature water ballet, lifesaving and water games will be given Monday through Friday, 5:30 to 7 p.m.

Warning Issued By Police as School's Out

School's out—be extra careful!
 These words of warning were issued today by traffic Sgt. Don Nash as thousands of students in the Torrance area put aside their books for the summer.
 Motorists are being urged by the Torrance police department to comply with the following precautions:
 1—Be extra alert near parks and playgrounds. Children will be crossing at intersections usually served by crossing guards, but not so protected during the summer.
 2—When driving through residential areas, keep speed down and eyes open.
 3—Watch for these "Indian Signs," which indicate that children might dash in front of your car:
 a—A ball in the street.
 b—Bicycles, whether in the street, on the sidewalk or on a driveway.
 c—Toys on the lawn or near the street.
 d—Children playing near the street.
 Parents should avoid sending their children on errands which require crossing busy streets, Nash reminded. They should encourage the children to play on playgrounds or fenced-in areas, preferably with adult supervision.
