

Graduating Seniors Earn \$57,000 in Scholarships

Graduating seniors at Torrance and North High Schools walked off with more than \$57,000 worth of scholarships this year, according to school officials. The city's newest high school, South High, had no graduating seniors.

Forty-six students at the two schools took 77 scholarships and awards offered by various groups, firms, and individuals. At all three schools, 192 students in all grades were picked for the Scholarship Society.

Thomas Lee Carter, a straight "A" student at Torrance High School, was the top winner, receiving an appointment to the U. S. Naval Academy from Sen. William F. Knowland. He also was offered a four-year scholarship to Yale and a four-year NROTC scholarship. He won first place in science competition of the Bank of America Achievement Awards, the California Scholarship Federation Seymour Memorial Award, second place in American Chemical Society competition, and a Bausch-Lomb Science Award.

David Burdick, THS senior class president, won a four-year scholarship to Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, Troy, N. Y., as well as a National Merit Scholarship letter of commendation and a certificate in Bank of America competition.

A National Merit Scholarship

Award finalist, Walter A. Sapp, NHS senior, won the \$2500 Pacific Smelting Corp. Scholarship and will study math at UCLA.

Torrance High students Betty Yoshioka and Len Ehlers each won \$2400 scholarship to Whittier College, while Bill Lee, NHS, and Richard Ryon, THS, were each given \$800 Torrance Educational Assn. Scholarship. Lee also was third in Bank of America zone English finals and Ryon was a Bausch-Lomb Science Award winner.

Torrance Council PTA Scholarships, worth \$250 each, were given to Jim Warnemuende, NHS, and Gary Burgner, THS.

North High Student Assembly won a \$100 National Supply Co. scholarship, and Richard Ryon, THS, took a \$100 prize in the firm's annual essay contest.

Paul Loranger Automotive Scholarships, worth \$150, went to LeRoy David Starbuck, NHS, and Melvin Lee French Jr., THS.

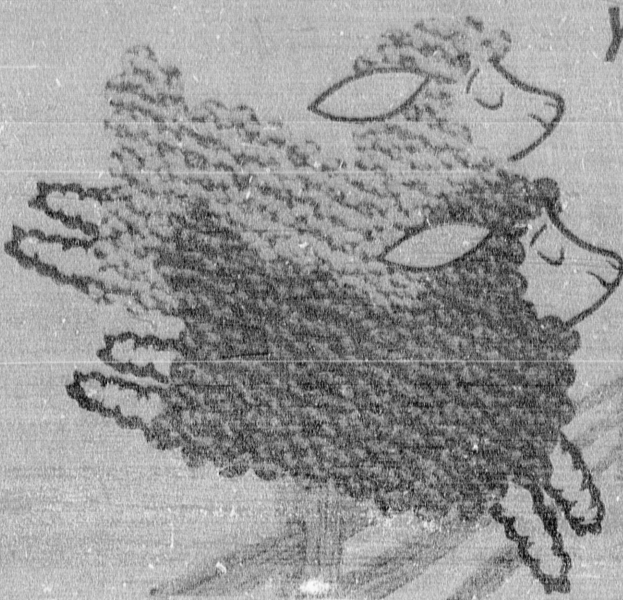
