## New Slogan, Signal Urged By Chief for Boat Safety

With the long 4th of July week end coming up, Chief of Police Percy Bennett today urged use of a timely new signal and slogan to save lives over the long week end—and all summer.

"Many of our citizens will be among the 30 millions of Americans of all ages who enjoy the invigorating and pleasant sport of boating. It is one of the safest forms of recreation, but just as boating has its irresponsible 'rot-rodd jockeys' and 'drag race show-offs' so does boating have a few smartalecks who imperil the safety of themselves and others," he declared.

Chief Bennett added that out of a desire to curb the outlandish and exhibitionistic behavior of this reckless minority has sprung a new idea—"thumbs down means don't clown." The objective is simply to discourage goofy and dangerous antics by giving the familiar "thumbs down" gesture to the offender.

Public safety authorities suggest that whenever a person is seen making a pest of himself by clownish behavior in or around a boat, or for that matter in an auto on the highway, annoyed or endangered bystanders can give the unmistakable "thumbs down" sign—a universally recognized signal of disapproval. When the "goof off" offender sees enough people make this sign, he'll know he's doing something he shouldn't do, even if he can't hear above the roar of a motor. He'll know that others know it, too. If, in common with the vast majority, he's a fair sportsman, psychologists say he will stop his foolishness and act like a gentleman.

So—let's all remember—"thumbs down means don't clown." Also, when towing a boat, don't forget to have proper lights on trailer and drive extra carefully, advises Chief Bennett.

The ceremonies honoring a total of 64 employees were part of a nationwide celebration commemorating the CAA's 20th anniversary.

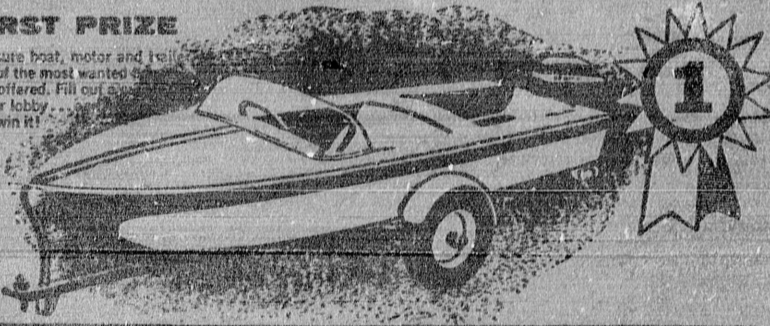
## GARDENERS CHECKLIST

1. Feed Tuberos Begonias on regular schedule. Pick up new plants at your nursery. Be sure to try some in hanging baskets.
2. Pick blooming roses to arrange as cut flowers. Do not allow seed pods to form since these sap the strength of the plant.
3. Dig deep basin around shrubs and trees and soak thoroughly. This will help retain moisture and you will need to water less often.
4. Remove foliage from spring bulbs, tulips, daffodils, etc. after it has died back.
5. Attack weeds vigorously with one of the good commercial preparations your nurseryman can recommend.

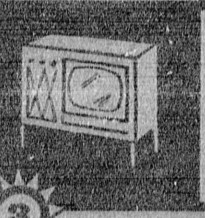
