

# Summer Recreation Program Gets Under Way in Torrance

**SPORTS** — Summer Recreation Torrance is going all out for the summer recreation program. A variety of activities have been planned for Torrance residents this summer under the direction of the Torrance recreation department in cooperation with the Torrance Unified school district.

**Park Areas**  
The week of June 17, El Retiro, McMaster, Sea-Air, Torrance and Walters Parks will have a recreation program from 1 p.m. to evening hours, starting June 23 and continuing through Aug. 29, the program on all of these areas will begin at 9 a.m. and continue through the early evening hours.

**School Areas**  
From June 30 to Aug. 1st, 1958, the following schools will be open for a supervised program from 1:30 p.m. Following the close of the summer school session and continuing to Aug. 29, the schools will have a program from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. for schools are Anna, Irving, Dan, Cranston, Flavian, Greenwood, Hillside, Hollywood, Howard Wood, Parkway, Perry, Sepulveda, Steele and Seaside.

Registration for swimming lessons for children between the ages of 7 and 12 years will be held on a first-come-first-served basis at the municipal plunge on Monday through Saturday mornings 9 a.m. to 12 noon.

**Day Camp**  
Day camp for boys and girls between the ages of 7 and 12 years of age will be conducted at Torrance Park July 29-Aug. 1, El Retiro Park Aug. 6-Aug. 8, El Nido Park Aug. 1-Aug. 15th. There is a small fee for each child per session which covers the cost of a beverage daily, a special field trip, and craft supplies used during the week. Registrations are now being accepted at the Torrance recreation dept. and a maximum of 20 will be allowed each session.

**Art Classes**  
A special summer series of art lessons will be held at the old City Hall in the new Craft Center. Under the direction of Miss Gallett, three sessions will be held each consisting of 15 minutes each. There is a small fee which covers the cost of equipment used and instruction. Children between the ages of 6 and 9 years will meet from 9 to 10:15 a.m. and those from 10 to 15 years will meet from 10:30 to 12 noon. Dates for the sessions are as follows: June 24 through July 10, July 15 through July 31 and Aug. 5 through Aug. 21. Each class meets twice a week on Tuesday and Thursday.

**Field Trips**  
Weekly field trips to nearby points of interest will be scheduled throughout the summer. Full information will be available on the areas after the beginning of the summer program, regarding the exact locations and dates for various trips. A fee of \$1.00 per trip is charged which covers transportation costs, a special treat somewhere along the way, and any admission that might be charged to the trip site.

**Adult Swimming Classes**  
Adult swimming classes will be held every Wednesday from 5:30-6:30 p.m. beginning June 30 at the Victor E. Branstead Plunge. Special classes at the pool will be held Monday and Wednesday from 5:30-7 p.m. There will be water ballet classes on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 7:00-8:00 p.m. will be life saving and water games. Family night is Thursday, 7-10 p.m. and adults only Friday night 7-10 p.m. Tennis and softball leagues have been set up in the Ivy League, Skyline and Rocky Mt. dept.
