## Civil Service Examinations Set for DMV

State-wide civil service examinations to fill 50 positions as driver license examiners for the State Department of Motor Vehicles, were announced here today by Charles S. Caldwell, manager of the local DMV branch office.

Final filing date, Caldwell said, is July 11, for the examinations to be held August 2 in various parts of the state by the California State Personnel Board.

Salary range for the positions, open to men only, is \$373 to \$438. The motor vehicles manager here said qualifications for admission to the examinations include:

Education equivalent to graduation from college and/or four years of business experience involving wide public contacts.

All candidates must be United States citizens.

## Innes Shoe Co. President Dies

Funeral services will be conducted at Grace Chapel, Inglewood Park Cemetery, at 11 a.m. tomorrow for Paul M. Seigel, 50, president of the Innes Shoe Co. of Los Angeles since 1949. Mr. Seigel died Thursday night.

Mr. Seigel, widely known for his direction of the Innes retail chain of shoe stores, began his career in the shoe business in Chicago, and remained 28 years with his first employer. He was in a general executive capacity when he retired to the West Coast.

He returned to the shoe business shortly thereafter as president of a Fresno shoe company, and in 1948, he and associates purchased the Innes Shoe Co. Two years later, the firm was bought by General Shoe Corp. and Mr. Seigel set about to expand the operations of the Innes chain, which now includes 41 units.

Mr. Seigel was a member of the board of directors of Los Angeles 57th Church of Christ

Providence, R.I., on April 24, 1900, and lived in Pacific Palisades.

He is survived by his wife, Helen, his daughter, Mrs. Barney Goldsaw, and two grandsons.



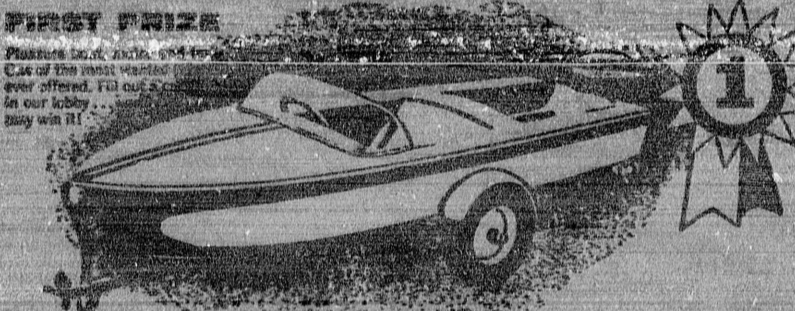
