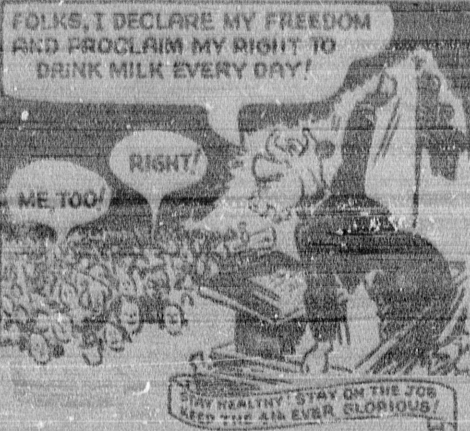

Eastern Star Unit Marks '57 Night'

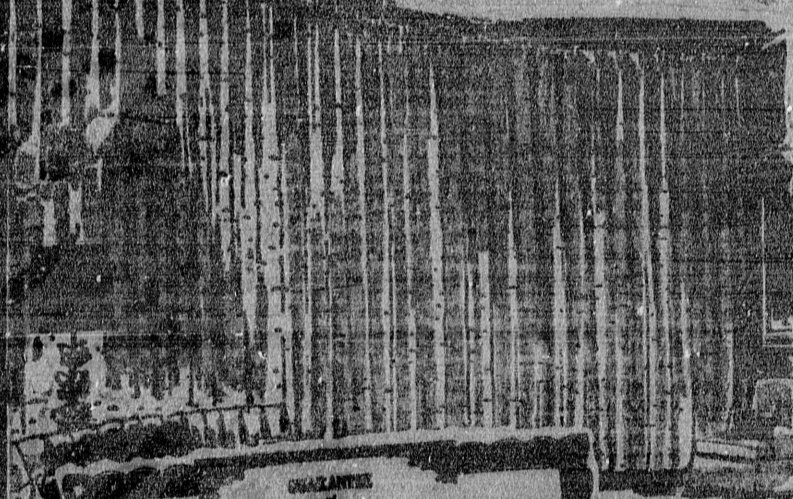
