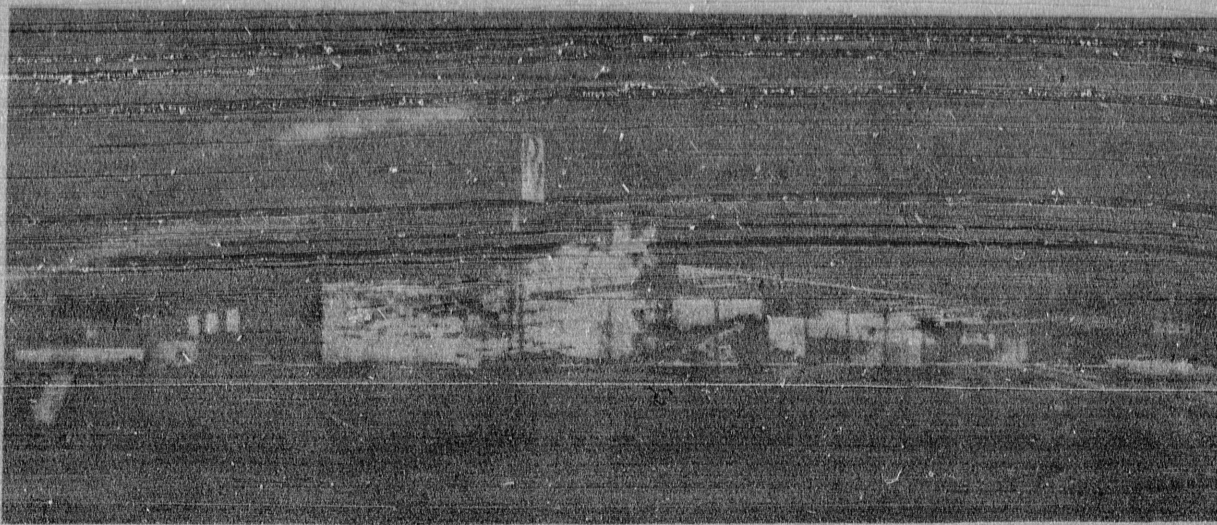

Supervisors Plan Condemnation Action for Dominguez Channel

In preparing for constructing permanent improvements of Dominguez channel between Denker Ave. and Gramercy Pl., the Board of Supervisors this week authorized the filing of condemnation action to acquire easements on nine parcels of land along the channel at Western Ave. Supervisor Kenneth Hahn announced today.

Since it is expected that the \$2,000,000 project will be advertised for bids within 30 days, the condemnation resolution authorized the County Counsel to obtain an order of immediate possession on the property, if necessary, so that the construction program would not be delayed.

Channel Widened
Improvement of this reach of the channel is the second in a series which will widen and deepen Dominguez channel upstream from Vermont avenue to 120th St. and Crenshaw Blvd.

Supervisor Hahn pointed out that the first unit of the work between Vermont Ave. and Denker, was completed last fall.

The new permanent channel will be 75 feet wide on a right of way of 125 feet and will have concrete sides and bottom.

In order to accommodate the wider channel section, the state highway department is now constructing a new bridge across the channel on Artesia just west of Western Ave.

Bridges Planned
Plans for the project coming up include construction of new bridges at Western Ave. and at Gramercy Pl.

Supervisor Hahn pointed out that much of the flooding of the Centumela valley in the past has been caused by the inability of flood waters to pass through the narrow culverts under the streets.

CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULED... Builders are scheduled to begin work immediately on this new 24-lane bowling alley and recreation center at 24698 Crenshaw Blvd., to be known as the Palos Verdes Bowl. Developed by John D. Howard, who is developing industrial property adjacent to the site, the new building was designed by Don Engen of Ashmore, Engen, and D'Agostino. It will represent an investment of nearly three-quarters of a million dollars.

Ground Broken for New 24 Lane Bowling Alley on Crenshaw Blvd.

Ground breaking ceremonies were held Tuesday for Torrance's new \$600,000 Palos Verdes Bowl at 24698 Crenshaw Blvd. Scheduled for completion in mid-November, the 24-lane recreational facility will be a major component in a 15-acre industrial-commercial tract currently being developed by the Jackbilt Corp.

The Palos Verdes Bowl will represent a major step toward lessening the shortage of bowling facilities in the Torrance-South Bay area, according to John D. Howard, president of Jackbilt, developer of the tract and contractor for the unit. It will also, he said, provide another solid hub around which future industrial expansion in this community can be built.

Partner in the Palos Verdes Bowl with Howard is Harry Sternfeld who will operate the facility.

As bowling has become a family sport, he said, everything in and around the Palos Verdes Bowl is aimed at group recreation. Before it was designed, the architects, Johnson, Engen and D'Agostino, visited more than 100 bowling centers in Southern California to determine how such centers could be improved and made more comfortable for all members of the family. In addition, they had previously designed

eight bowling centers and had this experience on which to draw.

Among the innovations is locating the coffee shop close to the playing area to eliminate the necessity for players to leave their game for refreshments; booth-type seats just behind the playing area where non-playing spectators can observe and have refreshments simultaneously; and for the children, a large nursery and play area well stocked with toys.

The structure itself will contain approximately 24,000 square feet and be decorated in a contemporary California motif. The major wall of the structure, that facing the bowlers as they arrive, will be built from famed Palos Verdes stone. Included will be a coffee shop, cocktail lounge, quickie bar for serving players and spectators, and a fully equipped kitchen. A 35,000-square-foot parking lot will adjoin the building.

Brunswick-Balke, Colander and Quincy bowling equipment which includes automatic pinsetters, underfloor ball returns, and high volume forced air hand dryers at each alley.
