Golf Lessons Set At Sea-Aire Park

Beginning this week golf lessons will be offered to teenagers and adults by the Torrance recreation department. Lessons for the teenagers will be free, whereas the adult lessons will carry a small fee per session.

The teenage classes will meet twice a week on Wednesdays and Thursdays for a period of three weeks. Each class will have six students.

Three series of classes will run during the summer and each series will contain four classes. The three series are: July 9 through July 24, July 30 through Aug. 14, and Aug. 20 through Sept. 4. Each series will have classes at the following times: 8 to 9:30 a.m., 9:30 to 10:30 a.m., and 5:30 to 6 p.m.

In addition to the free lessons, the Sea-Aire Teenage Golf Club, sponsored by the recreation department invites interested teenagers to join and participate in their activities which include tournaments, trips and social activities. The outstanding event of the summer for the teenagers will be the club championship tournament at the end of the summer. Perpetual trophies

are to be donated by the Alondra Optimist Club, one for the boy and one for the girl champion.

Instruction is also being offered to the adults. There will be three series of lessons, each series consists of five classes. The series that will be offered are: July 9 through July 24, July 30 through Aug. 14, Aug. 20 through Sept. 4. Times for the classes are: 6 to 8:30 p.m., 8:30 to 7 p.m., 7 to 7:30 p.m., 7:30 to 8 p.m., and 8 to 8:30 p.m.

Tackle baiting albacore moved in within range of border city fishing vessels, about 50 to 60 miles south of the Colorado, as anglers decked 400 and better Saturday and 588 Sunday.

Schools of the much sought after chicken of the sea are real junkers, several pushing the 40 pound mark, tapper brought to gaff by a Los Angeles addict sinking the scales to 44 1/2.
