**PROTEIN FOODS**

POULTRY is again the leader. Frolics keep consumers well supplied with both chickens and turkeys, while other items in meat departments are less plentiful.

Save time — save effort — have another good meal. Research at Purdue University shows that fried chicken locks good and tastes good if frozen — pieces are frozen and served even four days later. To be at its best the chicken should be wrapped in foil and frozen within three hours after it is cooked. Thaw at room temperature for serving.

This experiment revealed that the frozen chicken showed no noticeable change or loss in quality. The only difference over fresh was in the refrigerator for the same length of time showed a noticeable drop in quality.

The new crop turkeys are moving to our markets. They are a special treat, and you can get the whole birds or cut parts, halves, or quarters.

**BEEF, LAMB, PORK.** Lamb is high in comparison to beef. One report indicates that the lambs from mountain states will be here soon, and may change the market. Values in the meat departments vary from market to market, and if you have a special need you may have to shop carefully to keep within your budget. There'll be fully-cooked picnics on "special" in some areas.

**EGGS** are still abundant, but prices show tendency to "firm."

**ON THE PRODUCE STANDS**

These abundant vegetables would combine to make a succulent, colorful salad:

- Bell peppers
- Cucumbers
- Lettuce
- Romaine
- Tomatoes

Tomatoes are improving greatly in quality. Shipments are much heavier. Prices are falling at wholesale and con-

These abundant vegetables should expect to see the lowered prices reflected at retail.

**AVOCADOS**... summer varieties, the moving in. Haas is the one you'll see most of this summer. It's a quality fruit.

**BERRIES.** Both strawberries and boysenberries are plentiful enough for some homemakers to think of freezing and canning. Ask your produce man about prices by the tray.

**PEACHES.** It's July Elberta time — about the end of season for most of the other early varieties. Red Haven is the earliest peach recommended for freezing. But the season is really just getting rolling. Californians are promised a big peach season. Three million bags are heading our way.
