The two recipes contributed today are old southern dishes which Mrs. Robert Petrini, 2503 Brian St. secured while living in Texas. They have been tried by the Petrini and have been distributed to friends. The "Ozark Pudding" recipe was given to Mrs. Petrini by an old negro "mamma" and the other "Barbecued Pork Chops" comes from a member of a long line southern family.

Barbecued Pork Chops: Salt and pepper five pork chops. Brown in hot fat in skillet. Pour off nearly all fat. Make barbecue sauce, heat to boiling point, pour over chops. Oven bake at 350 degrees for 1 1/2 hours. Turn chops over once. Add water during cooking if necessary. Cover for cooking.

Ozark Pudding: 1 egg, 1/2 tsp. salt, 3/4 c sugar, 1 tsp. vanilla, 6 tbsp. flour, 1 tsp. baking powder, 1 1/2 tsp. chopped pecans. Mix egg and sugar. Then add all ingredients. Bake in buttered pan at 350 degrees for 30 minutes or until done.
