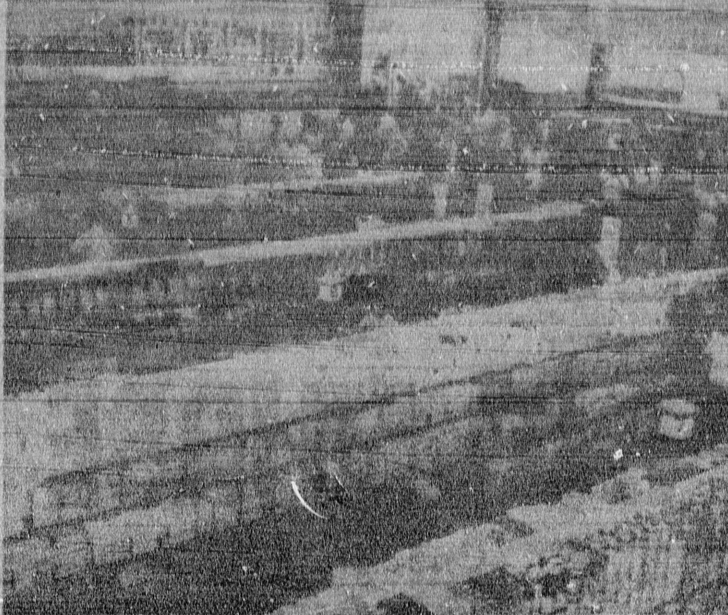
Harbor Freeway Extension Set To Open Friday

The Harbor freeway will be open as far as Century boulevard Friday, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn stated today.

After a personal inspection of this freeway link with R. F. Flecker, resident highway engineer, Hahn was informed that the extension of the Harbor freeway southbound from approximately 20th street to Century boulevard, with the actual turn-off at Golden avenue (36th street), would take place. Northbound traffic on the Harbor freeway will use the on-ramp at Century boulevard and the existing ramps of the Harbor freeway at 90th street will be blocked off.

Two More Lanes
It will be necessary to construct two additional lanes on the freeway when the temporary on-ramps and off-ramps at 60th street are removed.

Supervisor Hahn also was informed by State highway officials in Sacramento that bids for the next major link of the Harbor freeway, from 124th to 190th streets, should be advertised for construction in August.

Plaster Has Versatile Use

Gypsum or portland cement plaster, which is composed of proper proportions of plaster, aggregate and water, has been used as long as man has been building structures to work and live in. The modern uses of lightweight aggregate materials that serve the purposes of reducing the weight of the material without lessening its effectiveness as a fire barrier continue to make it the most versatile of building materials.

Gypsum plaster, when mixed with water, forms a binder which holds the aggregate together. When this compound dries it returns to a hard, rock-like substance much like the form it was in when it was mined from the ground.

Court Convicts Man in Unemployment Chisel

Judge Donald Armstrong, sitting in Torrance Municipal court Thursday, cracked down on a man convicted of illegally obtaining unemployment compensation from the Torrance office, State Employment Service.

Henry W. Hay, currently residing in Huntington Park, was convicted of accepting \$250 as unemployed while working for an aircraft plant. Hay was sentenced to six months in jail with all but 30 days suspended. He was placed under probation for three years and was ordered to make full restitution.

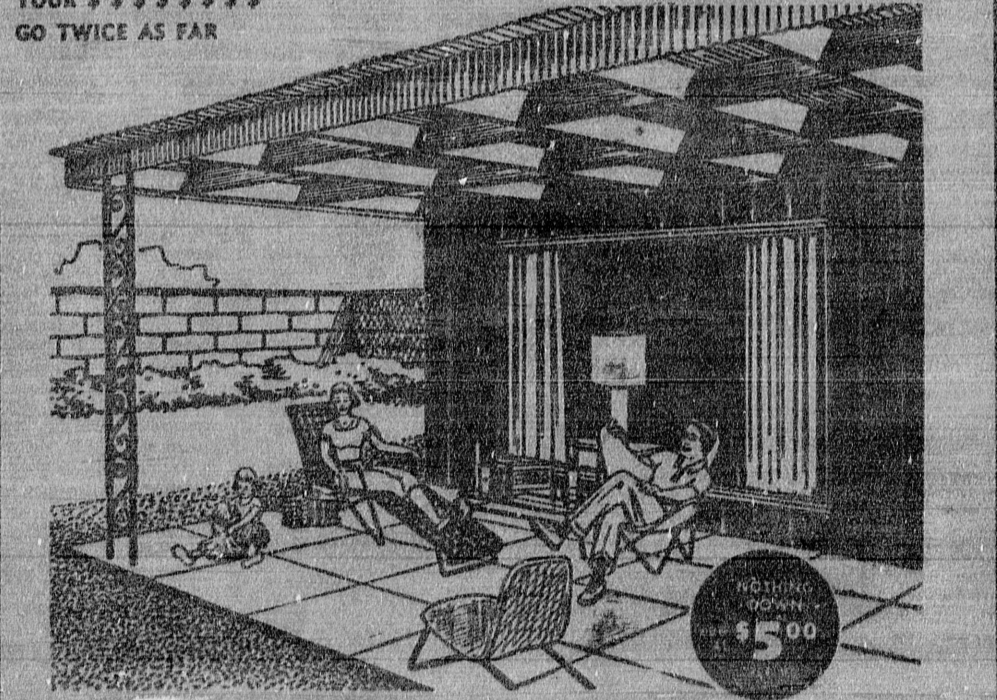


