Voter Registration Now in Full Swing

Registration of voters for the Nov. 4 general election is in full swing and will continue through Sept. 11, Benjamin S. Eite, registrar of voters, has announced.

He pointed out there are six classes of persons who should register or re-register:

1. Those who have changed their addresses since they last registered.
2. Those who have changed their names.
3. Those who desire to change their political affiliation.
4. Those whose registrations were canceled because they did not vote at either the primary or general election in 1956, and who have not re-registered since the cancellation.
5. Those who have become of age and have not registered.
6. New residents of Los Angeles County who will have the required qualifications by the date of the election.

These qualifications are: one year's residence in the state, 90 days in the county, and 21 years of age; a naturalized citizen must have been a citizen for at least 90 days prior to election date, and must show his naturalization papers to the deputy when registering for the first time; all voters must be able to read and write the English language, and sign their names, and must not be disqualified to vote by reason of a felony conviction.

MOSQUITO ABATEMENT PROPOSED

Members of the Del Amo Civic Improvement Assn. are circulating petitions to join the Compton Mosquito Abatement District.

The association will meet Tuesday, 8 p.m. at Calvary Baptist Church, 117 W. Milton St., to discuss the petitions and to answer questions.

Spokesmen for the group said the current drive to rid the area of swamp and drain mosquito breeding areas is now in progress.

According to the group, the only way to get the areas sprayed is to join another abatement district and Compton is the closest.

The Compton district has indicated it will accept the local area if residents can obtain 10 per cent of the registered voters' signatures in the area.

Cost of the project is estimated at two cents per \$100 assessed valuation.

All those who live in the Del Amo area are urged to attend Compton's meeting.
