### Contributions to Thrift Shop Will Help Handicapped

Residents of the Torrance area will soon have an opportunity to help provide job-training for handicapped men and women through contributions of outgrown clothing and household articles to Community Thrift Shop in Long Beach. Several disabled men and women from this vicinity are current trainees at Community Rehabilitation Industries in Long Beach. It was learned this week.

Sale of contributed materials at Community Thrift Shop will add needed funds to CPI's job-training program for men and women rejected by industry. Opening ceremonies for the new shop have been set for noon July 28. Location of the store is at 660 Pine Ave. in downtown Long Beach.

Mrs. Mildred Kolan, formerly of 20495 S. Normandie Ave. and a Long Beach resident since coming to the hemiplegic program since Jan. 27 she has been rotated in training to assist potential skills. Dr. James Howard, research director, reports Mrs. Kolan should be ready for job placement about Oct. 1.

Youth Jotie Rooks, Charles A. Slatten, 20, of 18329 Roslyn St. joined the ranks of hemiplegics when an automobile accident which killed three other teenagers left him paralyzed along the left side of his body.

Slatten, who was disabled before he was old enough to prepare for a job, is learning tool re-conditioning at CRI. He has been a member of the project since June 9. He has advanced to two days per week in production work. Dr. Howard reported, and will continue at this rate until he is skilled for full-time production work.

Mrs. Kolan is a 50-year-old former Detroit taxicab driver. Her hemiplegic condition is the result of a slugging attack and robbery while she was so employed. After emerging from a four-day coma, she learned of her paralysis. Mrs. Kolan never gave up in her attempt to support herself, but her condition barred her from any job paying more than a pittance.

Has Some Hope  
A nearby Longdale, Barbara Ann Shaffer, 25, of 4163 W. 166th St. has some hope for self-support. A hemiplegic since birth, she has never been employed. Today she is learning new skills at small assembly work and tool-sorting.

Seventeen men and women have entered the hemiplegic research project since January. Now in various stages of processing and screening for entry are 35 others. A total of 105 hopefuls are ready. It is for these men and women
