

Ex-Torrance High Teacher To Edit New L.A. Magazine

Torrance area writers, poets and essayists were invited today to submit their work to "L.A.," a new magazine for metropolitan Los Angeles which will make its debut here next month.

Editor Myron Roberts, former Torrance High school teacher, announced that the magazine is seeking material dealing with themes of interest to residents of Southern California.

"We are looking for stories, articles, poems, and essays of normal magazine length. The subject matter will vary, but we are naturally most interested in material with a local theme or setting. Effective style and original ideas are what we are looking for rather than 'How To' articles, gimmicks, tourist information, etc.," Roberts said.

LA Magazine is also looking for quality photographs, cartoons and sketches, Roberts announced. "All material submitted through the mail will be examined carefully. While we will have some work by established writers, we will find room in every issue for fresh local talent."

Water Co. Pact Testimony Ends

Testimony on the validity of a pact between Torrance and the Dominguez Water Co. has been taken under submission by Commission Examiner Grant Sybers following six days of hearings.

Witnesses for both sides of the controversy appeared at the week-long hearing into the agreement which calls for the private water firm to turn over

to the City its service facilities in the Southwest Park area of Torrance. Dominguez Water Co. officials contend the firm was forced into the agreement.

Residents of the area testified that water supplied by the firm sometimes had odors and discoloration, and that the pressure was occasionally low.

Recommendations of the commission examiner are expected to be sent to the commission early next year. In the meantime, both sides of the dispute have 90 days in which to file briefs and replies.

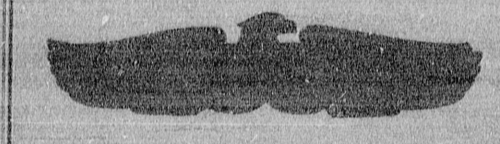
