Lesson-Sermon Topic 'Spirit'

wide range of sizes. The new plant is a special requirement. Capacity of the new smelter is more than 100,000 pounds of aluminum yearly.

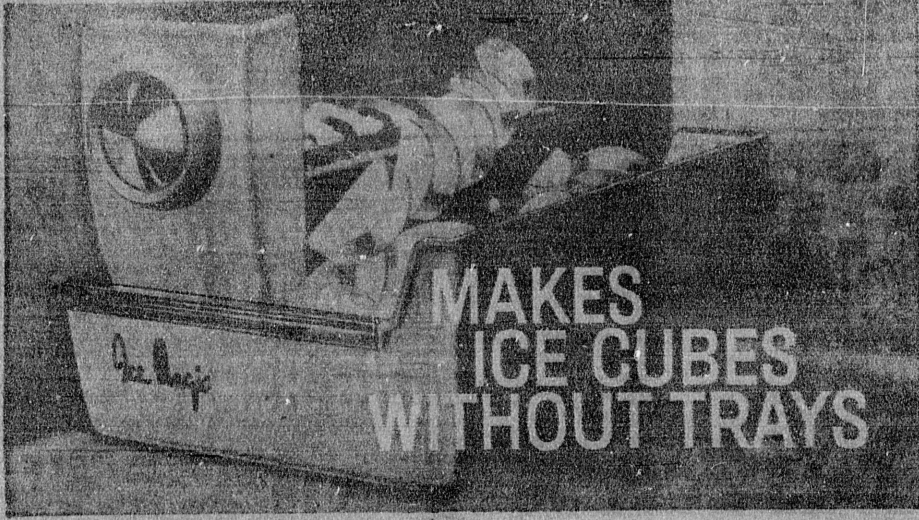
"Our entry into the primary picture, to round out our activities, culminates a 16-year program of blood, sweat, and tears," said Lawrence A. Harvey, executive vice president.
