Robbie Wollard started competitive skating at 11 and practices an average of four hours six days a week. He is enrolled in UCLA. His mother and father do dance skating and are skating judges.

The 1958 Metropolitan Conference football schedule was announced today by Commissioner Cecil G. Zaun.

Forty-three top notch games are scheduled for the eight college Metropolitan Conference, including those with some of the outstanding JC teams in the country.

Among the non-Conference JC teams on the Metro schedule are Taft, San Francisco, Mesa College, Pasadena, Porterville, Ventura, Cameron Aggies, Phoenix, Glendale, Fullerton, San Bernardino, Santa Ana, and Modesto.

The openers on Friday, September 19 bring together East Los Angeles JC and Taft on the former's home grounds, and Valley at San Francisco JC. Both are non-Conference games. The next evening, Saturday, September 20, Bakersfield College meets Mesa College from Colton.

The regular Metropolitan Conference schedule gets under way on Friday, October 10 with Bakersfield at East Los Angeles JC, and Long Beach CC at L. A. Harbor. Saturday night, October 11, El Camino College hosts Valley, and San Diego JC, 1958 Metro champs, plays Santa Monica CC in San Diego's Balboa Stadium.

The 1958 season ends on Thanksgiving Day, November 27, with Santa Monica traveling to Mesa College in Colorado.
