Kids Plus Crayons Equals Disaster, Librarian States

"Younger children with crayons . . . This was the answer of Scot Paxton, Torrance librarian, to 'what is most damaging to library books.'"

In general, and there definitely are exceptions, the young SC graduate librarian said that the books from the library's three branches are well cared for and are returned on time.

"But then comes a month like July when people are vacationing and the librarian sends the books back and off the overdue list."

THE TORRANCE library, which is operated by Los Angeles County with the city, records the turnover in population with the addition of 125 new patrons each week. The librarians check in and out an average of 8000 books a month.

IN SOME WAYS, their selections are hard to understand, he added. "About a year ago, the girls suddenly started reading 'Enchanted Summer' by Grace Gutwin Kisinger. It was just another romance, but the demand was indicative almost of a fad."

If you are interested in science and science fiction, he said, it is better to be very young. "We have some good books for them," he said, "but the science books for the middle age group of children are somewhat indifferent in value."

OF THE BOOKS in the library, two-thirds are non-fiction. Receiving considerable play in the non-fiction are technical books, especially on aircraft and automotive work.

Perhaps the link with the present which most adults can understand is the work of Jules Verne whose "Twenty Thousand Leagues Under the Sea" and "Mysterious Island" fascinated the daring youth more than 50 years ago. Although considered conservative and slightly old-fashioned today, he still challenges the imagination of the teen-agers.

Vacation Time is Something Else To Maintenance Crew of Schools

When is a vacation not a vacation? When school is out and a man is a school custodian.

Torrance has 24 schools and five more in the building process—being rushed in the hope they will be ready for occupancy this fall.

But take for example one Torrance school which expects to have 1200 pupils this fall.

LAST YEAR, the kindergarten and the first three grades were on double session. Two new rooms have been added, but this year it is expected that kindergarten and the first five grades will be on double session.

To maintain the entire school system there is a mowing crew which handles the lawns at all the schools, painters and electricians who work at all the schools also. The custodians are assigned to a particular school.

TAKE THE CASE of the school of 1200 described above, the custodial staff took two weeks off when school ended and then went to work. By then, summer school, attended by 300, was underway.

"We have had plenty to do," the head custodian said. "Starting at the ceiling, we have cleaned all the walls. We have waxed all the floors. Clean, scrub, wash windows. It's been a busy summer and the time has really passed fast. But not nearly as fast as it passes when school is in session and there are 1200 youngsters around. Then you don't have time to more than keep up with the bare essentials of work. During the summer we catch up on the many items which have to be done periodically but can't be done when school is in session."
