GARDENERS CHECKLIST

1. Primula malacoides, the Fairy Primrose is available in nurseries and should be set out early for late winter bloom.
2. Keep feeding tuberous begonias. Liquid fish every two weeks if plants are potted is about right; once a month if plants are in the ground.
3. Bearded iris can still be planted. Lift and divide crowded clumps in your garden, spreading steer manure into the soil if the rhizomes are to go back into the same spot.
4. Winter sweet peas should be planted now. Make sure you get winter, not summer, sweet peas.
5. Lift crowded daffodils if you failed to do it earlier, and if you can still remember where the crowded clumps were. Throw diseased or pest-ridden bulbs away.

New Executive Joins Coleman

Your Park Department

In our last article we named the first group of trees that are on our parkways; also their pests and disease.

The next tree is the camphor (Cinnamomum camphora). The city does not plant this tree any more, as the root system is shallow. It is free of pests and disease. It should have plenty of moisture when tree is young, and deep watering to drive the roots down. From the leaves of this tree commercial camphor is extracted. Cherry (Carolina Laurel). This tree is native to southeastern United States. It is a good tree; has a good root system, and needs only a small amount of water. It is relatively free of pests and disease.

but is a slow grower. We might state here that there are some estalpa trees (Elaeagnaceae) in our main park which are very beautiful when in bloom in June and July.

Elm (Chinese, Evergreen). Because of shallow root system, this tree is not planted by the city anymore, except to replace missing ones. It is subject to scales and webworms and should be sprayed with malathion. Please call your Park Department if any pests appear.

Eucalyptus (Scarlet Eucalyptus (Sideroxylon Rosea). These trees are good trees, need small amounts of water, have a strong shallow root sys-

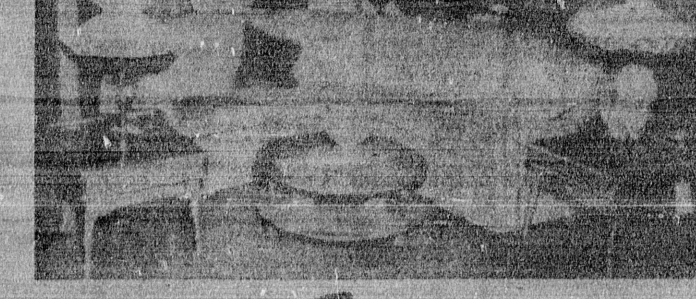
