Lesson-Sermon Theme Reported

The practical importance to day of the healing works of Christ Jesus will be brought out at Christian Science services Sunday.

Scriptural readings in the Lesson-Sermon entitled "Christ Jesus" will include the account in John's Gospel of Jesus' healing of the blind man. The account commences: "And as Jesus passed by, he saw a man which was blind from his birth." The man's healing is recorded when Jesus said, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam. . . . He went his way therefore, and washed, and came seeing" (1:7).

In "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" Mary Baker Eddy declares, "Christianity as Jesus taught it was not a creed, nor a system of ceremonies, nor a special gift from a ritualistic Jehovah, but it was the demonstration of divine Love casting out error and healing the sick, not merely in the name of Christ, or Truth, but in demonstration of Truth, as must be the case in the cycles of divine light" (p. 135).
