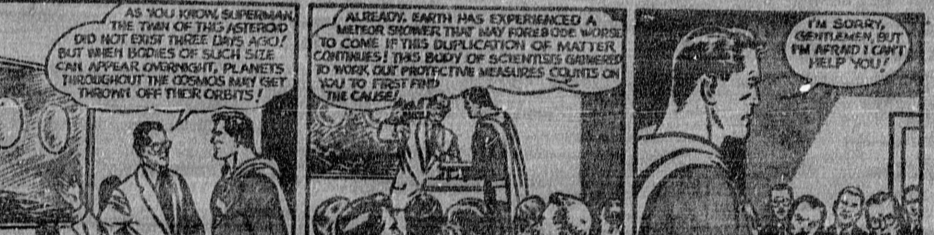

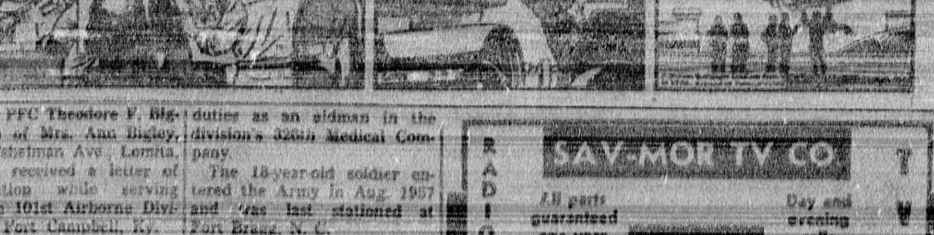

Supervisors Award Contract For Dominguez Channel Job

A contract for the permanent widening and improvement of Dominguez channel between Decker Ave. and Gramercy Pl., with the work scheduled to begin within 15 days, was awarded Tuesday by the Board of Supervisors. Project will provide increased flood control and protection to the cities of Gardena and Torrance, and the Centennial Valley. It is the second unit in a series of improvements planned to widen and improve the channel from Vermont Ave. up stream to 120th St. at Crenshaw Blvd.

CONSTRUCTION PLANS call for the building of a reinforced concrete channel, with a width of 75 feet and a depth of 18 feet, which will greatly increase the capacity of the stream to carry off storm waters. Bridges over the channel at Westway Ave. and Gramercy will be completely rebuilt to conform with the channel's increased capacity.

SUPERVISOR Kenneth Hahn pointed out that the small

culverts under the existing bridges have been inadequate to carry off storm water, and that debris jams against them, causing the water to back up. A bridge across the channel on Artesia Blvd. is now being built by the State Highway Department and is about half completed. Supervisor Hahn made a personal inspection of the channel during last winter's storm with Col. H. E. Hedger, chief engineer of the Flood Control District. At that time he requested Hedger to expedite the plans for the project so that the people of the areas served by Dominguez channel, including Gardena, Torrance, Lawndale, Hawthorne and adjacent communities, would have better protection from flooding.

PLANS ARE NOW being prepared for similar improvements to the channel between Gramercy and Redondo Beach Blvd., with this latter project scheduled for next year.
