Voter Registration Ends Sept. 11; Deputies Listed

Registration for the Nov. 4 election, which got under way last week in Torrance and Lomita, will continue until next Thursday, Sept. 11. Voters who have not as yet registered are urged by Mayor Albert Isen of Torrance to do so during the next seven days.

Persons required to register or re-register include:

- Those who have changed their addresses since they last registered;
- Those who desire to change their political affiliation;
- Those who have become of age and have not registered; and
- Those whose registrations were canceled because they did not vote at either the primary or general election in 1956 and who have not re-registered since said cancellation.

NEW RESIDENTS of Los Angeles County who will fulfill the required qualifications by election day are also required to register. By Nov. 4 these residents must fulfill the following qualifications:

- One year's residence in the State, 90 days' residence in the County, and they must be at least 21 years of age.
- A naturalized citizen must have been a citizen for at least 90 days prior to the date of the election, and must show his naturalization papers to the Deputy when registering for the first time.
- All voters must be able to read the English language and sign their name, and must not be disqualified to vote by reason of a felony conviction.
