The organization of a National Women's group composed of local league units was recommended by the Board of Directors of Little League Baseball, Inc. This is another measure for stabilizing the program and providing additional support and assistance to the local league. Upon this basis, the Torrance Little League Women's auxiliary applied for and was among the first to receive their National Women's Auxiliary Charter.

Since he refuses to get help, contact a lawyer or legal aid. When he sees that you DO have an alternative, he may straighten around to get you and the children back. AA could be his salvation, but he will have to go to them. They won't come to him.
