

### 'City to City' Finals Near

As a part of an overseas goodwill project sponsored by the Torrance Chamber of Commerce, five cities have been selected by the board of directors of Torrance's 'City to City' program. It was announced today by president Sam Van Wagner. Voting by local organizations will determine which city is to be invited to Torrance.

The five cities which are similar in many respects to Torrance include, Lahti, Finland; Konja, Turkey; Obenburgh, Germany; Norrköping, Sweden; and Valencia, Venezuela. A finalist will be selected at a general meeting of all Torrance organizations to be held Monday, Sept. 15 in the City Council Chamber.

Individuals who have a preference are asked to mail their vote to the 'City to City' Committee, c/o Torrance Chamber of Commerce, 1345 El Prado.

### CITIZENS STILL SIGN ELKS' DOPE PETITION

Even though several months have elapsed since the first petitions were put out asking for stronger laws on narcotics, residents of this area are still signing the petitions.

One petition by a restaurant cash register has 16 signatures on it. It has 20 places for signatures.

"Every once in a while, they still come in and pick up the signed petition, leaving us another one," the cashier said.

The petition in part declares "being fully aware of the destructive effects of narcotics among our citizens, the rapid rate of increase in narcotic addiction among teen age children . . . we hereby demand that the coming session of the California Legislature . . . enact legislation to make mandatory a 30-year minimum sentence without parole for any person convicted of selling heroin or other addictive drug in a manner not permitted by law."

Of the 16 signatures of the petition, 15 were apparently authentic. One was from Hermosa Beach, eight from Torrance, three from Lomita, one each from Redondo Beach, Long Beach and Los Angeles. Of the signers, seven were women.
