Man's God-Given Domain Sunday Lesson-Sermon

Man's fundamental right to freedom from all kinds of bondage will be explained in the Lesson-Sermon entitled "Man" at all Christian Science churches Sunday. The sermon is keyed to the Golden Text from Micah (6:8): "He hath showed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?"

Scriptural selections will include this passage from Romans: "For as many as are led by the spirit of God, they are the sons of God. For ye have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father" (8:14, 15). A correlative citation from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy declares, "The enslavement of man is not legitimate. It will cease when man enters into his heritage of freedom, his God-given dominion over the material senses. Mortals will some day assert their freedom in the name of Almighty God" (p. 228).
