For the first time Torrance female fishing addicts went down to defeat in their annual fishing derby with the Ocean-side Lady Anglers. Couguld have suffered their first loss under better conditions, as the 18 gals, nine from Torrance and nine from Oceanside, decked sea bass after sea bass until the bait ran out at the early hour of 10 a.m. aboard the Dutchess running out of Oceanside.
