

Torrance To Have Own FM Station

Gus S. Maloye of Manhattan Beach, and George Gillum, 3832 Emerald St., Torrance, both prominent in the radio and TV broadcasting fields, have been set by the South Bay Broadcasting Co. to help establish an FM radio station in the greater Torrance area. A construction permit has been granted South Bay Broadcasting for the station by the Federal Communications Commission.

Robert Crites co-owner with Jeff Clark of South Bay Broadcasting had the following comments for the Torrance HERALD:

"Currently, no radio station has the greater Torrance area as its primary service area. It is one of the fastest growing sections of Southern California, and we feel that it needs, can and will support our efforts. Our objective is complete local radio service.

"We are meeting with representatives of the Chamber of Commerce, social and civic organizations, and civic leaders in an attempt to sample the public's interest in our venture. We also have enlisted the co-operation of the Chamber of Commerce of Torrance and the Beach cities to take any inquiries about the station and relay them to us."

Harbor Freeway Bids To Be Opened Today

Bids for construction of a five-mile link of the Harbor Freeway will be opened today by the State Highway Department.

The freeway section, which parallels Figueroa St. between 124th and 190th St. is scheduled for completion in the summer of 1953, state officials have reported.

Opening of a 2.6-mile section from Century Blvd. to 124th St. is scheduled for next month, and construction of the large segment to 190th St. is expected to get under way shortly thereafter.

The project will cost about \$9 million and will extend the Harbor Freeway 15 miles southward from the four-level interchange in downtown Los Angeles.

Interchanges will be constructed at El Segundo Blvd., Roscomans Ave., Olive St., and 174th St.

A full cloverleaf interchange is scheduled near 190th St. which will handle interchange traffic from both the Harbor and San Diego Freeways.

"Construction of the Harbor Freeway to 190th St. will go a long way toward ending the congestion which has plagued the southern part of the county for many years," Supervisor Kenneth Hahn said. A major portion of the freeway lies in his supervisory district.

Coroner's Jury Holds Area Men In Fatal Fight

A Prescott, Ariz., coroner's jury ruled this week that a 30-year-old San Pedro man died as the result of blows struck during a fight with James Gray near Prescott Aug. 31.

Help by Arizona authorities is held, identified as a Torrance resident, and Herman Rogers.

The two were arrested by sheriff's deputies a short time after the death of Bill Meadows, of San Pedro, was discovered near Ash Fork, Ariz., about 50 miles from Prescott.

Herman, also identified as a resident of San Pedro, was held because he was reported to be present at the scene of the fatal scuffle.

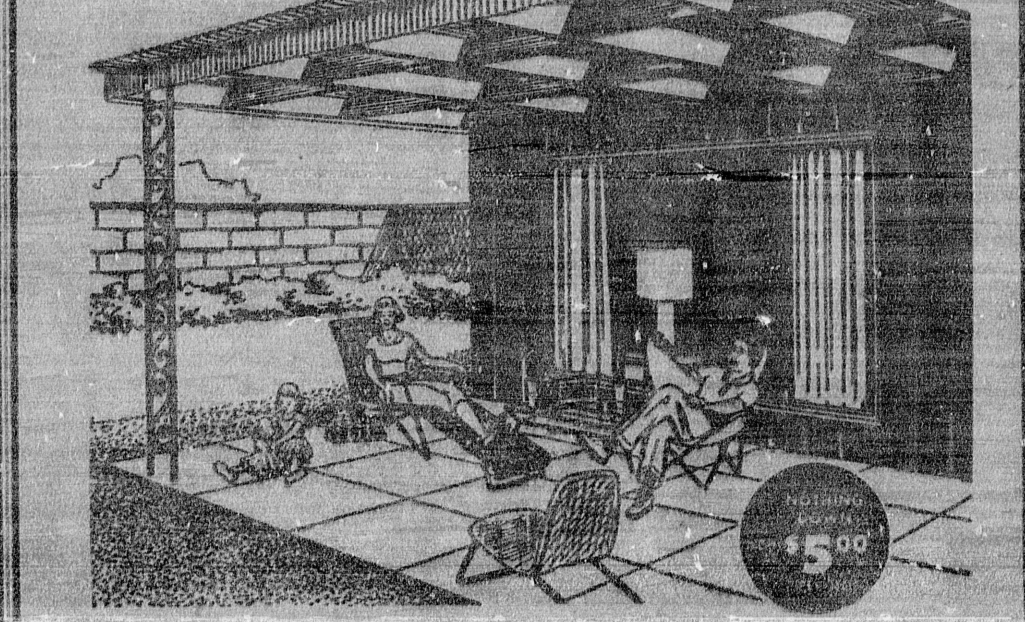
