## Realtors to Fight Proposition No. 17

Proposition 17 is one of the most damaging schemes ever attempted in California and the Torrance-Lomita Board of Realtors will use every resource at its command to help defeat it," Board President Harry Bowker declared yesterday.

In announcing the board's unanimous stand against the November ballot measure, Bowker said, "Every Californian must be warned that this tax-tampering initiative threatens to impose even higher taxes on the already overburdened property owner."

He explained that state officials have pointed out that by reducing the state sales tax from 3 per cent to 2 per cent, Proposition 17 would reduce revenue drastically and that other taxes would have to be imposed to make up the deficit.

Edwin L. Sorrels, vocational rehabilitation director of the Braille Institute of Los Angeles, will be guest speaker at a luncheon meeting of the Kiwanis Club of Waveria to be held at noon today at the Jump 'N' Jack restaurant, 2800 Pacific Coast Hwy., according to an announcement made by Dick Miller, program chairman.

Sorrels will discuss the institute's free services for the blind, outlining methods by which their lives are enriched in the areas of recreation, education, learning of trades, social welfare, and library service.

The Braille Institute is located at 741 N. Vermont Ave.

## Enrollment At El Camino To Reach New High

El Camino College will reach a new high when it greets a first-day enrollment of 9700 students on Monday, it was announced by Meri F. Sloan, director of student personnel today. This is an increase of 1000 students over last year's first day enrollment.

Late registrants may swell the total enrollment figure to 10,500. One last opportunity to register is offered on Tuesday, Sept. 16, between the hours of 1 and 3 p.m. and 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. Although they may have to take late afternoon or evening classes, there are still openings in about 30 per cent of the 1136 classes being offered this fall, it was announced.

In preparation for enrollment, 2700 high school graduates received counseling service and testing. Those services were received by an additional 1800 full-time students during the spring semester. Approximately 3500 part-time day and evening students checked their programs with counselors upon registering during August.

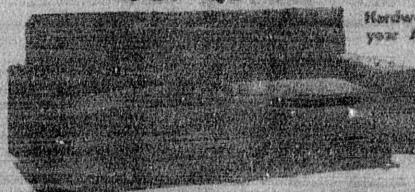

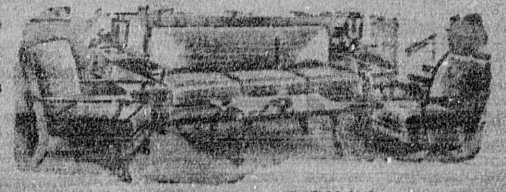

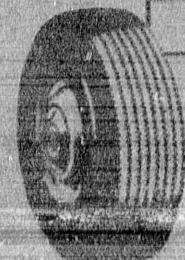
