If your son has had the proper training the unfortunate youngster won't be a bad influence on him. And it would help a great deal if you understood that it's unhelpfulness - NOT meanness - that makes him behave this way.

Spunking the child "until he can't sit down" is no solution. Rebelliousness cannot be beaten out of children. Such treatment will only make the boy more defiant and he'll behave in a more unacceptable manner to get even.

Suggest to the child's mother, in a friendly not a critical way, that she take her son to a doctor or a mental health clinic. You could do her and the boy a great service.

Dear Ann: I'm a medical doctor who read with interest your answer to "Dirty Paul," the chap who was married to the "crazy clean" woman who couldn't tolerate so much as a speck of dust. He had to leave his shoes at the door.
