Peter Seiler is amazed after being in the United States since last Friday. The 18-year-old youth is here from Bop- pard, Germany, on the Inter- national Student Exchange pro- gram and will be a guest in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Don Wolf, 21804 Halldale.

What amazed Peter most is "everything here is in a hurry—they wash cars in a few min- utes while in my country it takes a half-hour."

He was impressed with the number of cars on the high- ways, the speed that they travel and the great distances peo- ple drive on trips.
