Head of Nation's Air Defense Command to Visit Torrance Today

Lt. Gen. Charles A. Hart, commanding general of the nation's Army Air Defense Command, will attend ceremonies today marking the turnover of four Army Nike guided missile sites in this area to the 720th Missile Battalion, California National Guard.

Presently manned by regular army personnel of the 865th Missile Battalion, the four sites are the first in the nation to be put under operational control of a national guard unit.

General Hart, whose headquarters are in Colorado Springs, will be the main speaker at two of the sites to be converted—the Torrance site and the dual site at Playa del Rey.

The general will also be on hand to witness the turnover ceremony at the missile site in Long Beach and will be among special guests attending a luncheon at the Long Beach Petroleum Club, held in conjunction with the ceremonies.

Army Gives Ryan Million Dollar Order

Ryan Aeronautical Company has received a letter of intent from the Army authorizing production of RANAV Model 120A integrated automatic navigation and flight control systems, the electronics division of the San Diego firm revealed today.

The million-dollar letter contract will get under way a program expected to later become much larger in scope.

According to a Ryan spokesman, the order will provide the U.S. Army with an undisclosed quantity of advanced navigation and flight control systems based on prior work done by the aeronautical company during the past two years with the Army Electronics Proving Ground, Ft. Huachuca, Ariz. Ryan will have complete system responsibility for the Model 120A.
