

# Herald Publisher, 115 Others To Make Study-Tour of Europe

The National Editors Assn.'s European Study Mission, leaving New York Sept. 19, will have a look at such widely diverse matters as atomic energy plant and the newly inaugurated European Common Market, as well as the Brussels Worlds Fair, NATO, SHAPE and the significant French election on its proposed new constitution.

Publisher King Williams of the HERALD will make the trip. He will be accompanied by Mrs. Williams and her mother, Mrs. C. F. Young.

An extremely heavy study

program has been arranged for the group of 115 editors and publishers making the 17-day trip concluding Oct. 5, but some time has been left for sight-seeing in the Netherlands, Belgium, Paris and London, which comprise the itinerary.

PROBABLY THE highlight of the busy trip will be extensive entertaining at the great Brussels Worlds Fair, the day-long visit to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization and Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe in Paris, and the British Atomic Energy

plant at Harwell, England, but equally important will be a number of meetings with the European Common Market authorities in Brussels and in Paris.

The six powers of France, Italy, Germany, Belgium, the Netherlands and Luxembourg have joined in agreement to eliminate customs and other trade barriers and create a common market of about 160 million persons within the next decade or so. The transition steps already are in progress.

THE NEA MISSION will be

the largest single group of newspaper editors and publishers who have ever visited Europe at their own expense, and extensive arrangements have been made for them by the American Embassies and the governments in each country to be visited.

The mission will spend two days in the Netherlands, four days in Brussels, four days in Paris, and five days in London, returning to New York Oct. 5. Chief of the mission will be Edgar S. Rayol, executive vice president of the 73-year-old national newspaper publishers

association which has more than 6000 member newspapers in all states. Charles Nutter, Managing Director of International House in New Orleans will be in charge of the program which his organization arranged.

The trip will be the 31st International House Trade and Travel Mission conducted since 1946, five of which have been to Europe and the remainder to Latin America. International House handled the arrangements for the I.E.A. post-convention tour to Mexico and Guatemala earlier this year.

New Orleans is a unique trade promotion association devoted to World Peace, Trade and Understanding, and the promotion of foreign trade, primarily through New Orleans and the Gulf Ports of the United States. It works closely with several similar organizations in Boston, San Francisco, Cincinnati and elsewhere which it helped to organize since its inception in 1943.

Trade and Travel early were recognized as primary functions of International House, and its first mission was conducted in 1946. These have been followed at the rate of two or three each year during

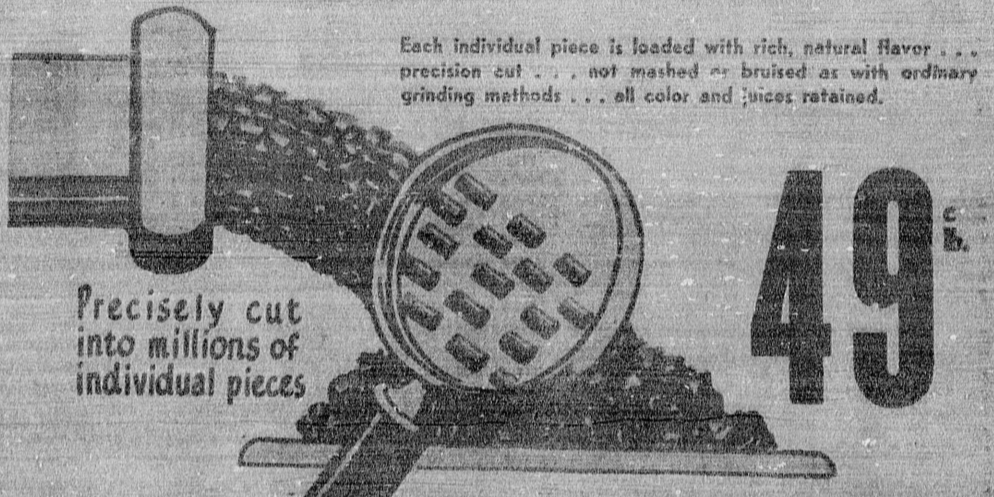
