

## Chapel Predicts Stricter Narcotics Laws in 1959

The California state legislature will enact stricter laws regarding the sale, possession, and use of narcotics during the 1959 regular session of the legislature, predicts State Assemblyman Charles Edward Chapel of the 46th district in his weekly report from the state capital.

Crediting this prediction to "an increased awareness of the vital necessity for stricter anti-narcotic laws" on the part of the legislators coupled with demand by the voters for action in the wake of the Elks' campaign, Chapel names Red China as the principal source of illegally imported narcotics, and calls for closer federal supervision of imports.

His report goes on to state that New York state is about to copy the new California drunk-driving laws, which call for stiffer penalties in cases involving this offense. He quotes Gov. Knight as commenting on the laws authored by Assemblyman Louis Pratt as follows:

## School to Sell Last of Bonds Next Oct. 21st

The last \$1,800,000 of the \$10,000,000 in building bonds authorized by the voters in

1955 will be sold on Oct. 21, the Torrance School Board decided Tuesday night. The Board of Supervisors will be asked to sell the bonds to provide money for the construction of the fourth unit of buildings at North High School, to complete the campus. Construction of additional school buildings will depend on the outcome of an Oct. 14 bond election, at which voters

will be asked to approve an additional \$15,000,000 for buildings in the next five years. According to school officials, the additional bond funds would be used for another new high school and four elementary schools, as well as expansion of many of the present schools and earthquake-proofing Fern School.

The \$10,000,000 authorized in 1955 was used to build seven elementary schools, part of the North and South High Schools, additions to six schools, additional needed district facilities, and to acquire four new school sites. Bonds are the method provided by the state for schools to get money for the construction of new buildings.
