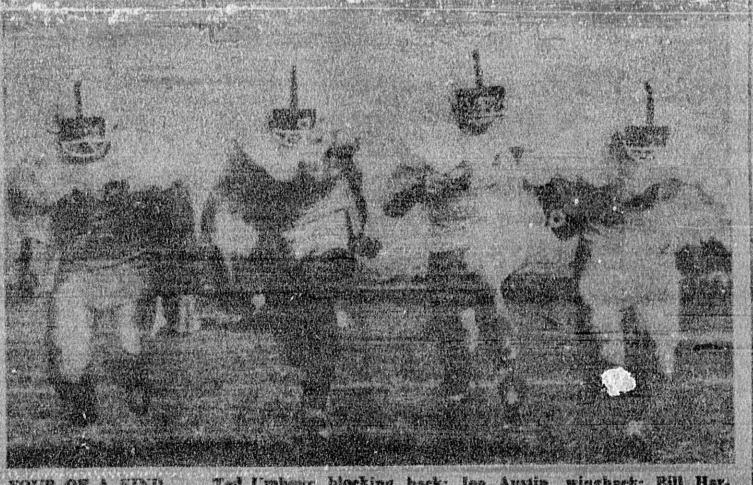
Bishop Montgomery High's first football squad, clad in black and gold, is preparing to clash with eight opponents this season.

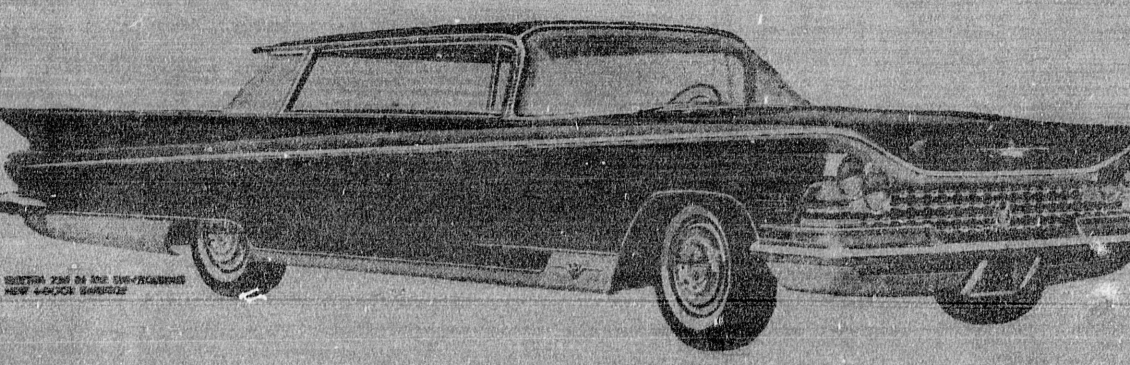




