### SPANISH EGGS

Saute: 2 slices bacon (chopped)  
1/2 c. chopped onion  
1/4 c. bell pepper (chopped)  
Simmer 15 to 20 minutes and add six hard-boiled eggs, quartered. Serve on toast. This is ideal for a quick lunch.

### DEVIL'S FOOD CAKE

1/2 c. water  
1/2 c. cocoa  
1 1/2 tsp. soda  
1 tsp. vanilla  
1 tsp. vinegar  
1 c. shortening  
1 1/4 c. sugar  
2 eggs (unbeaten)  
3/4 c. milk  
2 1/2 c. flour  
1/2 tsp. salt

### WHITE WONDER FROSTING

(Mix in Double Boiler)  
1/2 c. or 2 unbeaten egg whites  
1/2 cup sugar  
2 tsp. white corn syrup  
1-10 tsp. cream of tartar
