## Car Dealers Must Label True Price Under New Law

A new federal "truth-in-labeling" law, sponsored by the automobile dealers and motor car manufacturers, went into effect yesterday, making it a felony to fail to post the manufacturer's suggested price on new automobiles.

The law was introduced by Sen. A. S. Mike Monroney (D-Okla.) and passed earlier this year by Congress with the backing of the National Automobile Dealers' Assn. and auto manufacturers, who endorsed it and testified in its behalf.

It requires factories to affix and dealers to display on every new car a legal price tag listing the manufacturer's suggested price on the basic automobile, the dealer's shipping cost and amount charged for delivery plus a separate listing covering prices of optional equipment and accessories.

Also required on the "truth label" are the make, model and serial number of the car, its point of final assembly, the name and address of the dealer to whom the car was delivered and the method of its transportation—whether towed, driven or truck-transported—to the dealer.

All foreign made cars sold in the United States also are covered by the law.

A \$1000 fine is provided on conviction of failure to display the truth-label or for falsifying it or removing it before the car is sold to the ultimate consumer—the motorist. In addition, violators who illegally remove the labels are subject to possible one-year prison sentences.

## Douglas Signs New Contract for Production of Attack Bombers

Signing of a \$36,000,000 follow-on contract for additional Douglas A3D-2 carrier-based attack bombers was announced Monday by the Department of the Navy.

The A3D series, which is built at the Douglas Aircraft Company's El Segundo division, is naval aviation's heaviest carrier-based bomber, a twin-jet, swept-wing aircraft, operational with the fleet since 1956.

Contract specifications call for design refinements and changes which will improve the A3D's performance. Already a highly successful naval aircraft, it will gain in performance through use of cambered leading edge on the wing which will result in lower stall speeds and better stability at high speeds.

The El Segundo plant will build the new A3D's for delivery to the fleet beginning

in mid-1959 which will exceed production on the basic A3D aircraft into 1961.
