Proclamation

WHEREAS, the month of October has been set aside in the State of California for increased Parent-Teacher enrollment; and

WHEREAS, the objects of the Parent-Teacher Association are:

- To promote the welfare of children and youth in home, school, church and community;
- To raise the standards of home life;
- To secure adequate laws for the care and protection of children and youth;
- To bring into closer relation the home and the school, that parents and teachers may cooperate intelligently in the training of the child; and
- To develop between educators and the general public such united efforts as will secure for every child the highest advantages in physical, mental, social, and spiritual education; and

WHEREAS, in Torrance alone last year, membership in the 25 schools amounted to 15,981 and an even larger growth is expected this school term due to the rapid influx of population.
