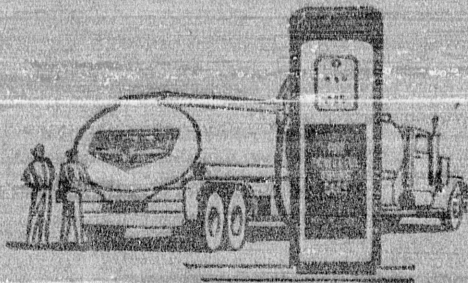
Lecturer Says Man Inherits Good Alone

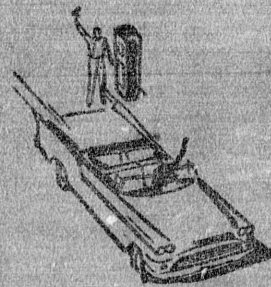
