Scoring three touchdowns in the first half, the Warren High Bears defeated North High's Saxons, 22 to 0, Saturday night in the opening game of the local eleven's fourth grid season. A third quarter safety accounted for the last two Warren points.

The locals returned after halftime an almost completely changed team. They made an impressive defensive showing holding the Bears to a 2-point safety scored when Chuck Webb's punt was blocked. Warren failed to score from the one-yard line early in the third period when the Saxon line held. However, the damage had been done in the first half.
