### Unveil Plaque Honoring ECC Boards of Trustees

Recognition of members of the El Camino College Board of Trustees, past, present and future, will be perpetuated on the campus of El Camino College following the unveiling of a plaque during the past week.

Presentation of the metal marker, which appears just inside the Crenshaw entrance to the college Administration Building, was made by Robert Russell of Twin Peaks, president of the first college board, Russell, a former resident of Redondo Beach and a member of local boards there, is now retired.

The dedication occurred on Sept. 22, prior to a dinner meeting honoring the lay educational leaders. The regular meeting of the current college board followed.
