Construction of New Hospital To Begin Tomorrow

Construction of a \$4,400,000 sanitarium and convalescent hospital to be located on the southeast corner of Hawthorne Blvd. and Garnet St. is expected to get under way tomorrow. The new facility will be known as the Bay Crest Sanitarium and Convalescent Hospital.

Private and semi-private rooms will be featured with several of them overlooking a landscaped patio garden. In addition, plans call for a recreation room which will house television and double as a solarium.

Included in the structure will be a physiotherapy wing and a stainless steel kitchen. When the hospital opens in March a registered physical therapist and a registered dietitian will be on the staff.
