## Pay-By-Mail Parking Plan Affects County Violators

Effective tomorrow, a pay-by-mail plan for overtime parking fines will be placed in effect for all unincorporated territory of the County and for 15 contract cities. Supervisor Kenneth Hahn announced today. Among the areas involved are Lomita, Rolling Hills, Rolling Hills Estates, Carson, and Dominguez.

The plan, which was worked out in cooperation with Sheriff Eugene Biscailuz, is expected to prove a boon to motorists getting tagged for overtime parking and also to save the taxpayers money.

Supervisor Hahn, who suggested the idea nearly a year ago, emphasized that only fines for overtime parking could be paid by mail. "This program does not include any type of moving violation," he declared.

## King, DiMiceli to Square Off At Chamber Breakfast Oct. 21

The two candidates for United States Congress representing this 17th Congressional District will be on the same platform as the highlight of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce's "Meet Your Candidates" breakfast meeting Tuesday, Oct. 21, at the Torrance civic auditorium starting at 7:30 a.m.

President Fred W. Mill said both Congressman Cecil R. King (Democrat) of Inglewood and Candidate Leonard DiMiceli (Republican) of San Pedro will answer questions posed by the chamber's legislative committee, all concerning legislation facing Congress next year.

**KING WAS BORN** at Fort Niagara, Youngstown, N.Y., and at the age of 10 moved with his family to southern Los Angeles. He was a businessman in the 17th Congressional District and has resided with wife and daughter in the 17th District continuously since 1957. King is an aviator, a member of the Alford Post 402 of the American Legion.

The incumbent congressman was elected to the California Legislature in 1952, 1956, 1958, and 1960 and was installed majority floor leader in 1956.

**KING WAS NOMINATED** and elected by the 17th District and has served consecutively in the 77th Congress through the 85th Congress, a total of 13 years.

He has served on numerous major committees of the House of Representatives — merchant marine and fisheries, rivers and harbors, insular affairs, civil service, patents, expenditures in execution, membership and King has served 13 years.

King is best known in the South Bay area for his effort in obtaining funds for the King Harbor in Redondo Beach and for his non-partisan leadership in exposing tax scandals as chairman of the House tax investigating committee.
