## Grape Festival Recipes

**RUMANI**  
Wrap 1 slice of bacon around a water chestnut and slice of chicken liver. Secure with a toothpick and fry in deep fat. Serve hot.

**STUFFED MUSHROOMS**  
1 tbsp. finely chopped onion  
1 2 1/2-oz. can deviled ham  
1 tsp. seasoned salt  
1 Bounce can mushroom crowns, drained—melted butter  
Cook onion in 1 tsp. butter over low heat until tender but not brown. Combine with deviled ham, crumbs, seasoned salt and Worcestershire sauce. Stuff mushrooms with mixture; brush with melted butter. Broil stuffed side up 5 to 8 minutes. Serve hot.

**AVOCADO BUTTER SPREAD**  
1 ripe avocado  
1/2 tsp. salt  
4 tsp. lemon juice  
Cut avocado in half lengthwise. Remove seed; scoop out pulp, keeping shells intact. Mash pulp and blend with other ingredients. Re-fill shells. Serve at once. Use as a spread on crackers, toast, breadsticks, potato chips or celery stalks.

**CHEESE PUFFS**  
1/2 lb. grated sharp cheese  
1 cup soft butter  
1/2 cup sifted flour  
Four or five hours ahead blend cheese with butter. Stir in flour, salt, paprika and mix well. Wrap 1 teaspoonful of this dough around each olive, covering the olive completely. Arrange on 1" baking sheet, ungreased. Refrigerate. About 1/2 hour before serving bake puffs in 400-degree oven 10 to 15 minutes. Serve warm. Makes 24 puffs.

**PARTY DIPS**  
1 1/2 qt. pkg. cream cheese  
4 slices bacon (chop, cook and drain)  
Worcestershire sauce (dash)  
1/2 tsp. salt  
1 large avocado  
Garlic salt  
1/4 cup milk or cream  
1/2 cup mayonnaise  
Blend all ingredients and refrigerate until serving. Serve with chips or crackers.
