

Harbor District Scouts Hold Week End Camp-O-Ree

RELIGIOUS SERVICES for the overnight campers will be held Sunday at 9 a.m. at the campsite. Awards will be presented at the closing ceremony at 11 a.m. Sunday.

Art Basile of Lomita, chairman of the Harbor District camping committee, is in charge of the Camp-O-Ree.

Explorer units will be in charge of the events, under the leadership of Charles Dresser of 23720 Allene.

Rotary Governor Pays Visit Here

The Rotary Club of Torrance was host yesterday to V. O. Walker, governor of the 528 district, Rotary International, paid his annual visit to the Torrance Club yesterday.

DiMiceli Urges All to Study The Constitution

Speaking before the Ft. Firm Masonic Lodge on the eve of their annual Constitution night, Leonard Di Miceli, candidate for Congress in the 17th District, stressed the point that no other single document has ever so completely, handsomely and simply spelled out the purposes and objectives of human life within the framework of a political and social system as does the American Constitution.

"It is a pitiable tragedy," he stated, "that so many Americans have not read the Constitution and have no real knowledge or understanding of its purposes, its ideals and the protection it provides."

"Because of a lack of a real understanding of our Constitution and the representative form of government it establishes," Di Miceli continued, "we are becoming alarmingly susceptible and receptive to what appear to be attractive proposals of guarantees against insecurity."

The candidate explained that our Constitution sets forth a separation of governmental powers so that no one arm of government may become so powerful, in itself, as to subjugate all Americans. He urged all Americans to read and re-read the Constitution.

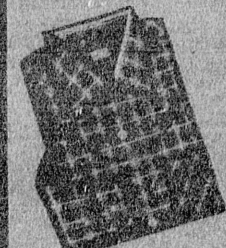
