ON THE PRODUCE STANDS
It's about time to think about "WITCH" FOODS TO CHOOSE FOR HALLOWEEN. Apples for apple bobbing, eating, and cooking. A wonderful crop, about 7 per cent above last year. DELICIOUS JONATHAN, MCINTOSH, NEWTON PEPPERS.

NUTS for cracking, unshelled. Keep best in cool, dark place.

PUMPKINS and SQUASH Pumpkins for jack-o-lanterns, both for pies and puddings.

CIDER and APPLE JUICE for sipping.

POPCORN for nibbling, popcorn balls, and caramel corn.

PEPPERMINTS and POMEGRANATES for treats and decorations.

ORNAMENTAL EGGS and COCKY just for fun.

CRANBERRIES, the biggest crop since 1953. Lots of these fresh berries for the abundant poultry and pork.

BONNETWEBS, the best of most of the remaining crop.

PEARS Bartlett's most in season, but Anjou and Bosc beginning to appear.

A long list of delicious vegetables: corn, lettuce, onions, tomatoes, and more and more cauliflower.

POTATOES. National estimates indicate about 12 per cent more than last year — perhaps a new high in production per acre.

SWEET POTATOES and

YAMS. We'll have a few more than we had last year, but 7 per cent below the average. Shippers are doing a fine job of sizing and grading California sweets and yams this season.

PROTEIN FOODS

This is the land of plenty at the harvest season! You'll be able to get just about any cut you want from any meat or poultry—at any market. Beef, lamb, pork and poultry are all streaming to market. Both turkeys and chickens fivers and stewing hens will be "specialized" at prices you'll appreciate. You may want to consider dropping some in the freezer. Be sure to wrap them properly.

EGGS go light along with the meat story. Even at regular prices they are a wise buy, but many markets are running "specials" which bring eggs into the bargain class.
